### **Arts integration lessons In Action**

During an arts integration lesson, students will exhibit a deepening of knowledge and demonstrate their understanding through the arts while experiencing both subjects at rigorous academic levels. This academic rigor uses higher level cognitive demands which develops critical thinking, independent judgment, and creative problemsolving skills. As vehicles for learning, arts integration lessons drive higher-order thinking skills to the forefront of the instruction and encourages the students to go deeper into the content.

Teachers are natural driven to collaborate more often with colleagues creating meaningful learning opportunities within each lesson. These lessons are taught using multiple intelligences, and an understanding of different learning styles that will support all learning styles.

Using the arts within the course of a student's daily learning routine will help bring concepts to life and bridge skill sets across disciplines, therefore, creating a positive learning experience.

## **Expectations for Administration** in an Arts integration School

After creating a school vision for arts integration and setting expectations of growth and goals, the next important step our team took was to begin collaboration and creating lessons this was possible because of an incredibly supportive administration team that vocalized not only the benefits of arts integration but laid the foundation of a strong program.

These foundational pillars are:

- Encouragement: Teachers are not often open to change and are often scared of failure; however, without failure, there will be no growth.
- Understanding: Teachers need to have reassurance that there are going to be expected ups & downs, and risk-taking in instruction is necessary.
- Openness: Teachers need to be supported by the knowledge that the administration will be open to request and feedback directly from the instructors on the need for collaborative time, the building of instructional teams, and professional development prospects.
